There was good competition for younger sheep as farmers are looking to restock after several years of drought. In particular there was strong enquiry for the fine wool ewes reflecting the huge gap in price between fine & coarse wool at the moment. Older lighter xbred ewes met with limited demand selling at only a small premium above schedule price.
