Prime Lambs		
A good size yarding of prime lambs sold to a mixed quality market, with the top end performing strongly throughout the sale. B Macaulay (Lincoln) was the standout vendor of the day, with 10 lambs making \$280–\$312 — the best price of the sale. WI Esson (Ellesmere) also achieved a sharp result with 12 lambs making \$288–\$296, while JRW & NB Hiatt (Cheviot) sold 19 head from \$256–\$298. Tarahau Ltd (Prebbleton) presented the widest quality spread with 62 lambs making \$211–\$301, and Okuku Farm (Oxford) yarded the largest draft of the sale at 67 head making \$200–\$229. BJ & SM Butters sold 25 lambs from \$239–\$270, Fitzallan Park (Southbridge) moved 50 head at \$245–\$261, and Moorpark Farm returned \$231–\$261 for their 14-head line. Ben Nevis P/S (Hanmer Springs) sold 17 lambs from \$210–\$230, Andara Farm (Spotswood) 16 head from \$216–\$237, and SJ Davison's (Diamond Harbour) 20-head line made \$234–\$236. Smaller drafts from PM Gamble (5 head, \$230–\$291), BM & HE Herries (10 head, \$234–\$256), Iffley Land Ltd (15 head, \$231–\$232), Rebecca Warren (9 head, to \$259) and MR Jack (18 head, to \$232) rounded out a good size yarding of mixed quality with good lambs selling well. Prime Sheep		
A good quality yarding of prime sheep sold very well, with prices rising in value compared to the previous few weeks. JP & LJ Thomson (Harewood) topped the ewe section for numbers with 56 ewes making \$170–\$268, while WD & MR Cullen (Homebush) achieved a strong \$184–\$290 for their 16-head line. Black Gate Farming (Omihi) presented two lines, with 36 2th ewes making \$186–\$196 and a mixed line of 32 ewes and wethers reaching a sharp \$162–\$314 — the top price of the sale. SJ Davison (Diamond Harbour) sold a good line of ewes from \$212–\$310, and Daly Farms (Cheviot) moved 34 head from \$198–\$272. Ben Nevis P/S (Hanmer Springs) sold 30 ewes at \$234–\$250, and JRW & NB Hiatt (Cheviot) cleared 11 ewes at \$240. Rams also sold to good competition, with the heavier lines making \$150–\$184 down to \$100–\$120 for the lighter end, and a top price of \$184. Store Lambs		
A small yarding of store lambs sold to good demand. Iffley Land (Scargill) sold a strong line of 106 ewe lambs making up to \$223, while A Blunt (Mt Steep) presented the larger draft of the day with 250 mixed-sex lambs making \$91–\$230.		
Prime Cattle		

A good yarding of prime cattle sold to strong competition, with steers trading \$4.80–\$5.20/kg, heifers \$4.70–\$5.21/kg and cows to \$5.88/kg. Stony Bay Point (Akaroa) sold the largest prime steer line of the day, 8 head making \$2472–\$2955, while Charnbrook (West Melton) added a single steer to \$3136. AR & MJ Sykes (Brookside) topped the heifer section for numbers with 15 head making \$2334–\$3098, and Charnbrook returned with 2 further heifers at \$3308–\$3367 — the top price of the sale. Barnett Trust (Woodend) sold 5 heifers from \$2621–\$2683, and Rob & Mel Ruck (Wairaki) yarded 2 prime cows to \$2250.

Store Cattle

Store cattle sold to a firm market, with steers trading \$5.00–\$5.20/kg and heifers \$4.95–\$5.18/kg. D D Galletly (Waiau) was the standout vendor with two well-presented lines — 13 steers making \$1290–\$1400 and 12 heifers making \$1270–\$1330. J B & C N McDermott (Prebbleton) sold 10 heifers from \$2120–\$2270, and M J Jordan sold 4 steers to \$2290.
