EWES / 2TH EWES / RAMS A good yarding of ewes, 2th ewes and rams sold to steady demand across the board. Knockindale Estate's ewes topped the market at \$259 twice over, with BMH Farming Limited (\$244) and I P Chamberlain and Co Ltd (\$244) also standing out among the 2th ewes. Rams from E W Coop & Sons and Hilltop Farm Trust made \$74-\$106. Top price - \$259 Heavy - \$214 - \$259 Medium - \$182 - \$214 Light - \$74 - \$176 Store lambs sold to strong competition throughout the sale, with A W & R E Preece's large pen of 177 topping the market at \$246, and S W G Chisnall's line also selling well at \$201. Rural Livestock had a lighter presence in the cattle yarding today, but pricing across the board remained firm. PRIME STEERS Steers sold from \$4.70 to a top of \$5.56/kg. K Wakelin's pen of Hereford X steers (735kg) topped Rural Livestock's entry at \$5.34/kg. PRIME HEIFERS Heifers made from \$3.50 through to \$5.36/kg. K Wakelin's Hereford X heifers led the Rural Livestock entry at \$5.31/kg (two lines, 695kg and 632.5kg). PRIME COWS A modest cow entry sold from \$3.20 to \$4.58/kg. BULLS A single Highland bull sold at \$5.02/kg.
